Hands on Training

(Feb. 27th - 28th, 0800hrs-1700hrs)

High Rise Operations **8 hours**

This course will provide students with multiple tools for high rise fire operations. Stations covered in this course will be stairwell stretches, high rise hose packs and deployments, hose line management techniques and Pressure Reducing Valves (PRVs). Students will be given information from some of the Nation's leading fire service instructors. The instructors combined have over a century of experience. This is a must have course even if you do not have high rise buildings in your first due area.

Engine Company Engagement - Stretching to Live Fire **8 hours**

Topics covered will include when to use 1 3/4" versus 2 1/2" hose, easy ways of handling each, and correct techniques for flowing them. This course will also cover stretching up stairwells and hoisting evolutions to LIVE fire conditions. This course is a must for any firefighter.

ESCAPE: Engine Survival Class and Personal Escape **8 hours**

This course will give any firefighter the tools for when the UNORDINARY happens. We train for success and rarely focus on having things go wrong. What do you do when things don't go as planned and we find ourselves re-grouping? This course will show options for extending a hose line that doesn't reach the fire, how to overcome kinked or pinched hose lines, or having to do the unthinkable, bailing out. Too many firefighters are dying on a hose line. Let's train for success but be ready to adapt and overcome.

Air Consumption & Emergency Survival (A.C.E.S.) 16 hours

The SCBA is not only the Number ONE tool you have to aid in rescuing victims from smoke and fire, it is also your LIFELINE. How well versed are you at using this tool? What will you do when you run out of air? How will you react if you are lost or trapped? Can you function effectively in a dark, smoky environment with a broken SCBA and less than 1000 psi left in the bottle?

This program will not only teach you things about your SCBA you may not know, it will teach you how to survive. Being lost, trapped or disoriented has a powerful pull towards panic. Preparation can help you keep your head under pressure and greatly increase your chance of survival. You will learn step-by-step procedures to overcome problems encountered by other firefighters on working fires. You will have the opportunity to practice these procedures in a live, smoke-filled environment while under stress.

This not a SCBA repair class, this is not a RIT class. It's you and your SCBA, It's your life.

Fire Fundamentals 8 hours

This course is designed to demonstrate fire behavior in several different live burn environments. The well-known flashover simulator will be used to demonstrate the signs of flashover and rollover. While in this setting, attendees will practice with a thermal imager to recognize and appreciate heat signatures and temperature changes. In the burn building, an emphasis on thermal balance and the importance of well-placed ventilation and hose stream application will be demonstrated. The greatest fire service debate of fog versus solid stream will not be solved in this class; however, key concepts will be addressed and demonstrated. Safety is paramount and all burns will exceed the standards of NFPA 1403.

Vent, Enter, Search 8 hours

This class has become a signature course of the OFC and an overwhelming favorite of attendees. Vent, Enter, Search is a very simple concept that puts firefighters in the best position to rescue a victim of fire. This course will break down the steps of this search technique and allow the attendees to gain confidence in its application. The course culminates in the application of VES in a setting that presents realistic challenges and obstacles.
